








#### The Impact to Businesses Due to the Disasters



## **Business Continuity**

Business Continuity is the capability of an organisation to continue the delivery of products and services within acceptable time frames at predefined capacity during a disruption.

Enterprises are encouraged to plan and implement **business continuity plans** to minimise disruption to your operations and ensure that business remains viable during the virus outbreak.



## Pandemic

A pandemic is an outbreak resulting in the spread of an infectious disease worldwide. It usually occurs when the whole population has **no immunity** to the disease, which is more common when there have been no cases in the community before. Pandemics can be caused by different diseases, ranging from the mild to the very severe.

In the last decade, Singapore have experienced two pandemics:

- Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) in 2003
- H1N1 influenza in 2009



## COVID-19

The COVID-19 belongs to a family of viruses known as the **Coronaviruses**, which can cause illnesses ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases, such as the **Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS)** and **Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS)**. The COVID-19 infections started in China but confirmed infections have also been reported in Singapore and other parts of the world.

The symptoms of the COVID-19 are similar to that of regular pneumonia. Typical symptoms include fever, runny nose, sore throat, cough and shortness of breath.



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# Key Considerations for Business Continuity Planning for Pandemic

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## **Business Continuity Manager**

#### **Roles & Responsibilities**


- Actively monitor alert levels
- Educate employees on disease and mode of transmission
- Collate contact information of all employees
- Ensure at least one designated Point of Contact is appointed to liaise with MOH
- Check MOH website daily & update employees accordingly
- Quarantine employees who have travelled to affected areas for sufficient number of days
- Appoint staff to keep quarantined employees informed of events in office
- Ensure workplace has adequate tissue paper, disinfectants and masks

## **Business Continuity Manager** Roles & Responsibilities

- Brief employees on personal hygiene measures
- Put up proper hand washing techniques notices in washrooms
- Ensure common areas are disinfected daily
- Designate isolation bay in the office and identify isolation route
- Identify hospital / clinics that unwell employees can be brought to
- Carry out symptom or temperature monitoring, where advised by MOH
- Ensure required recourses are available and able to support for split operations
- An assistant Business Continuity Manager should be appointed as a backup








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
#### **WHO Pandemic Warning Phases**

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
#### **DORSCON** Alert Level




